Clavey, McNutt Chair 2011-12 Fund Drive

As North Arkansas College starts a new era under President Jackie Elliott, the college's foundation will benefit from the leadership of two outstanding Harrison business leaders. Helen Clavey and Mike McNutt are serving as co-chairs of the 2011-2012 North Arkansas College Foundation Annual Fund Drive.

Clavey, North Arkansas College and McNutt are connected in a variety of ways.

The president and chief executive officer of Claridge Products and Equipment, Helen served on the Northark Foundation Board for five years.

Mike attended North Arkansas College before finishing his bachelor's degree at the University of Arkansas.

Helen watched Mike grow up, and she made a decision nearly 15 years ago that enabled him to start his own company, Distribution Services, Inc. (DSI).

"Between them, Helen and Mike employ nearly 500 people, just in Harrison," says Dr. Jim Stockton, vice president for institutional advancement at Northark and executive director of the North Arkansas College Foundation, Inc. "They both support our college and recognize its importance to the community."

McNutt started DSI in 1997 with one customer: Claridge Products and Equipment. Now, he employs 135 people,

has three other locations in Arkansas, and serves 48 states.

As a former student and the college's 2011 Distinguished Alumnus, Mike appreciates Northark's value to area high school graduates.

"It's a great, great option from the standpoint of affordability," he says. "You can stay at home, work, and save some money."

The quality of the education he received at his local college still resonates with McNutt.

"Attending Northark prepared me for the University of Arkansas," he explains. "I received personal attention from my instructors because they cared that much about my success."

From the early days of the college, employees of Claridge Products and Equipment have taken classes at Northark.

"I can't imagine Harrison without the college here," Helen says. "It's such an important part of the community."

"It has provided so many opportunities for area people," she continues. "Serving on the Foundation Board made me even more aware of the college and its needs."

The Clavey-McNutt team is already a proven winner. Mike remembers the day his dream for DSI became a reality.

"Claridge had committed to the concept of an external trucking company," he remembers. "I met with the company's management team, and some of them had doubts about using a startup business. Finally, Mrs. Clavey stood up and said, 'We're going with Mike.'"

Watching Mike grow up and knowing the kind of man he had become prompted Helen's decision.

"When I think of Mike, I think of responsible and level-headed," Helen says of McNutt. "I have a lot of admiration for him."

Mike remains grateful for the opportunity Helen afforded him.

"DSI wouldn't be here if Helen hadn't taken a chance on me," he says. "She

Unrestricted donations to the Foundation made these discretionary grants possible.

"I appreciate the support the Northark Foundation provides for our PBL members," said Cheryl Keymer, business instructor and longtime PBL advisor. "This support has enabled these students to compete at the national and state levels and make their dreams come true."

Courtney Clark and Linda Tameyo of North Arkansas College placed second in Human Resource Management at the national competition.

Lisa Dicus and Bryan Somers presented Northark's Hope Tree Project and placed third for Community Service Project. Started in 1984, the Hope Tree Project gathers Christmas presents for

area underprovided children. Over 450 children received gifts in 2010.

Somers also finished fifth nationally in Business Law. Sally Mills was ninth in Marketing Concepts, Courtney Clark and Janeyce Wood placed fourth in Management Analysis and Decision Making, and Haley Murray was sixth in Public Speaking.

Earlier in the year Northark's PBL students won 40 awards at the Arkansas Leadership Conference. Both at the national and state conferences, they competed with students from four-year universities.

DEDUCTIBILITY OF GIFTS – Gifts as a charitable contribution to the North Arkansas College Foundation, Inc. are almost always tax-deductible. However, there are some exceptions. Entry fees for the Foundation's 3-Person Scramble Golf Tournament are not deductible because golfers receive benefits (green fees, food and gifts) and an opportunity to win prizes that equal or exceed the value of their entry fee. Also, tickets for the Foundation's annual Evening on the Plaza Dinner are deductible only for the amount that exceeds the value received in food and entertainment by supporters attending dinner. The Foundation estimates its cost for food and entertainment per person for the 2011 Evening on the Plaza at \$10. Of the \$25 ticket cost, \$15 should generally be tax-deductible. Donors should consult with their own tax advisor concerning specific circumstances.

The 2011-2012 Annual Fund Drive runs from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. Last year's campaign **generated \$271,973 in gifts from 337 donors**. Over the past 25 years, the Foundation has received almost \$10 million from over 1,600 donors for a variety of Northark projects, including scholarships, endowed chairs for faculty development, the John Paul Hammerschmidt Lecture Series, computer labs, buildings and facilities, and academic programs.
